The Hebrew name "Jehovah" is generally translated in the Authorized Version (and the Revised Version has not departed from this rule) by the word LORD printed in small capitals, to distinguish it from the rendering of the Hebrew *Adonai* and the Greek *Kurios*, which are also rendered Lord, but printed in the usual type. The Hebrew word is translated "Jehovah" only in [Exodus 6:3](#); [Psalms 83:18](#); [Isaiah 12:2](#); [26:4](#), and in the compound names mentioned below (Jehosheba, Jehovah-jireh) [Easton Bible Dictionary](#)

The English name Jehovah was coined by Roman Catholics sometime in the Middle Ages, based on a misunderstanding of Masoretic Hebrew texts. It is a hybrid word consisting of the consonants YHVH (the "J" used to be pronounced as "Y") and the vowels for the word "Adonai." Though "Jehovah" is used a few times in the 1611 King James Version (e.g., Gen 22:14; Exod 6:3; Ps 83:18; Isa 12:2) and is found in many older hymns, it is not an authentic biblical pronunciation of God's name.
